Proverbs 11:28

Those who trust in their riches will fall, but the righteous will thrive like a green leaf

Proverbs 16:16

How much better to get wisdom than gold, to get insight rather than silver!

Proverbs 23:4-5

Do not wear yourself out to get rich; do not trust your own cleverness. Cast but a glance at riches, and they are gone, for they will surely sprout wings and fly off to the sky like an eagle.

Read through 1 Timothy 6:6-10 and 1 Timothy 6:17-19

- b. are already 'rich in this present age'?
